Range Rules

General (Applicable to all ranges)

- Before shooting, members must have signed in and ensured the Red Flag is Flying outside.
- Membership cards must be carried at all times.
- Visitors/Guests are not permitted to shoot at the Ballygraffan Range.
- Members must sign in their Visitor/Guest and will be responsible for their conduct.
- No firearm is to be handled when persons are forward of the firing line.
- Non shooters are prohibited from stepping on to the firing line with active shooters.
- Members are prohibited from running internal competitions or to charge members for such competitions without the prior consent of the management committee.
- The shooting of wildlife is prohibited on the range and in the car park.
- Please pick up your Brass and put it in the bin provided.

Firearms and Ranges (all)

- The use of AR15 type/ look alike rifles are restricted to the 20-30m Range.
- High velocity ammunition is prohibited.
- Rapid fire shooting is prohibited.
- Cross lane firing is prohibited.
- Approved distances for each range must be adhered to.
- Magazines with a capacity of more than 10 rounds are prohibited.
- No firearm is to be handled when persons are forward of the firing line.
- Non shooters are prohibited from stepping on to the firing line with active shooters.

20m to 30m Pistol and Sporting Rifle Range

- The maximum centre fire ammunition this range is passed for is -32/ 7-65mm and -44 in Black Powder Cap and Ball.
- Magnum pistols and rifles are prohibited.
- High velocity ammunition is prohibited.
- Rapid fire shooting is prohibited without committee approval.
- Target frames should not be higher than 1-5m to the centre of the target or lower than 1-3m.
- Target frames must be placed at the approved distances of 20m, 25m or 30m.
- No handgun shooting on a Sunday – except air pistols

50m to 100yd Smallbore Range

- Only clips or tape may be used to secure targets to target frames. Staples are prohibited.
- The target frames provided are for specific types of NSRA competition targets, it is the members responsibility to use the correct target frame.
- At target change over, bolts must be removed, or flags placed in the rifle breech before going forward. Rifles are to be left on the firing line and are not to be carried forward.
- Only targets 33 to 48 may be used for 50m Benchrest Shooting.
- Targets 41 to 46 may be used for 100 yd Benchrest Shooting
- Target frames must be placed at the approved distances of 50m or 100yds.
